Forum #2 – Survey Questions

Draft survey / Discussion Questions

Below is a list of survey questions to be posted to the Nation's app.

INTRODUCTION

The 'Namgis First Nation is creating a Cemetery Plan to guide the care and future of the three cemeteries under our control. We have consulted with the community and have created a Draft Cemetery Plan. We are looking for your input on these draft plans so that we can make adjustments in the Final Cemetery Plan.

'NAMGIS (WOOD ST.) CEMETERY

The proposed 'Namgis (Wood St.) Cemetery improvements include:

- a) *Formalization of the grave layout, to ensure that all graves can be accessed for digging even if interments have taken place around them.*
- b) *Family plot layout that includes up to 10 graves which can be reserved by family groups. Families can reserve more than one plot group if needed.*
- c) *A gathering space.*
- d) *An area for columbaria – upright structures that hold cremated remains in individual “niches”.*
- e) *A 4m wide cemetery driveway for operational access.*
- f) *A split-rail fence along Wood St to protect the graves that are along the cemetery's edge.*
- g) *An entrance and exit gate with signage, including interpretive signage that outlines cultural protocols in the cemetery, such as no photos, and to help signal the transition into sacred space.*
- h) *An area for potential future expansion.*

GATU RD. (ANGLICAN) CEMETERY

The proposed Gatu Road (Anglican) Cemetery improvements include:

- a) Family plots of 10 graves which can be reserved by family groups. Families can reserve more than one plot group if needed.*
- b) Gathering spaces.*
- c) Tree and shrub buffer along existing cemetery edge and Gatu Road, to better enclose the space.*
- d) Cemetery driveway linking Gatu Rd to Alti Rd.*
- a) Vehicle and pedestrian entrances with cemetery sign and information signage with historical information and rules for visiting/viewing the cemetery.*
- e) Updated pedestrian entrance with interpretive sign, and pedestrian path through the existing cemetery.*
- f) A buffer area around the existing burial area, to ensure potential unmarked graves are not disturbed.*
